Context

The HERMMES approach to media education is described in its title - Holistic Education, Resilience and Media Maturity in Educational Settings. It aims to provide resources to education professionals, parents (and guardians) and all stakeholders involved in supporting a child or a young person on their journey to becoming a sovereign user of all media forms, including digital media. In the age of rapid digital technology development which brings countless new opportunities as well as risks, one has to rethink why, when, and how to introduce which parts of this technology to children and young people. To attempt answering these questions and to provide practical, tailored guidance for interested educators and parents, in 2022 twelve organisations joined forces and set out on a three-year journey to bring together their expertise and design guidelines, a framework curriculum with practice examples, a community and culture guide, trainings and more. Next to the HERMMES ambassador training described here, we also offer (1) the HERMMES learning journeys which are online courses for adults working with 0-18 year old learners and (2) materials for parents' online self-learning. The purpose of these two learning journeys is to directly support educators and parents in their approach to holistic media education. To understand the aim of the HERMMES ambassador training one has to take a step back. Its aim, as shown in the graphic below, is to equip professionals with skills, knowledge, and experience to provide their own direct support to educators and parents in their approach to holistic media education.

As part of designing the ambassador course, a try-out training took place on 22-29 October 2023 in Ostrava, in cooperation with the National Pedagogical Institute and the Association of Waldorf schools of Czechia. In a week packed with courses and workshops, seven lecturers and 25 participants experienced the elements of the training and provided thorough feedback.

This ambassador course in its final form is fully aligned with all the other elements of the HERMMES project.


Why choose this training?

After completing the HERMMES ambassador training, participants will be able to:

- Teach in teacher training and continuous professional development courses for kindergarten or school teachers;
- Advise groups of parents looking for solutions when it comes to parenting in the digital age;
- Adapt curricula for alternative education settings in line with national requirements;
- Guide schools and kindergartens towards getting the HERMMES label for educational institutions;
- Advocate for the HERMMES approach with government bodies and associated decision-makers.

Who is this for?



Format and duration


The training will take place across the span of 15 months (e.g., October 2025 to December 2026). The training is designed to be delivered in all of the following formats.



Content


The content of the training is offered in various formats, according to the map above and is presented below in chronological order which is spread across the entire 15 months of the training.


